#### S. Res. 392, Forensic Science Week

- Pending for CY 2022

## Extending Temporary Emergency Scheduling of Fentanyl Analogues included in the CR

- -Bill provides temporary reauthorization until March 11, 2022
- -There is debate among the Members as to a permanent path forward.

### **LEGISLATIVE: 117th Congress**

#### Justice for All Reauthorization Act (JFAA)

Discussions began in 2019 with drafting in 2020

- First round of negotiations between the CFSO and IP per the Senate Judiciary Committee
- Second round of discussion with stakeholders
- Legislation reauthorizes:
- Coverdell Grants (technical corrections included regarding accreditation and other administrative matters, increases grant funding)
- Kirk Bloodsworth

### **LEGISLATIVE: 117th Congress**

#### Justice for All Reauthorization Act (JFAA)...Continued

- DNA R&D
- Wrongful Conviction
- Realignment of OIFS from NIJ up to an OJP level office
- Directs a triennial "Needs Assessment" of forensic science
- Amends Debbie Smith Act
- Senate draft to be introduced
- Passage expected before the end of the year

#### **LEGISLATIVE: 117<sup>th</sup> Congress**

#### **ME Legislation**

- Assistance in medical examiner and coroner workforce shortage
- -Loan forgiveness/repayment for Forensic Pathologists
- -Certification help and training money for forensic death investigators
- -Funded fellowships in Forensic Pathology that are already authorized and approving more
- NamUs Authorization
- Expected to be introduced formally shortly
- Bipartisan and working toward Bicameral


#### **LEGISLATIVE: 117th Congress**

#### **National Violent Death Reporting System (NVDRS)**

-Working with Safe States to expand funding

#### **NIST**

- -OSAC legislation no longer on the table
- -SDO is authorized under the COMPETE Act -Passed House on Feb. 8, 2022



#### Non-Legislative Items

#### **Medico-Legal Death Investigation-Data-Working Group**

- A CDC/NIJ collaborative group was formed in 2020 called the MDI-Data-WG which includes many CFSO members (two chairs)
- Looking at ME/C data to determine collection and sharing of data
- Group is tasked with multi-year project of developing recommendations for federal government on ME/C data collection and exchange
- Report pending




- White papers published

  - Developing an implementation Guide for DART-MS



#### **Standards Development Organization Funding**

CFSO supports authorization and appropriation for forensic science standards development at forensic science standards development organizations.

#### Fentanyl Bill

This bill extends until October 22, 2021, the temporary scheduling order issued by the Drug Enforcement Administration to place fentanyl-related substances in schedule I of the Controlled Substances Act. The bill was signed into law on May 4, 2021.

The previous order (PL 116-114) extended the last scheduling and also requested a GAO report to look at the matter. Titled "Synthetic Opioids, Considerations for the Class-Wide Scheduling of Fentanyl-Related Substances" (attached). The GAO report was sent to Congress in April 2021.

The GAO report provides analyzed documents, data and statements for Federal, state and local stakeholders. It focused on the "effects related to drug classification, research, and federal law enforcement and effects from the classification of similar substances."

#### FY22 Budget
